Although there are plenty of historical monuments in the Old Town (Ciutar Vella), Barcelona is best known for the scores of buildings in the Eixemple left by the artistic explosion of Modernisme in the decades around 1900.

10.15 Visit Sagrada Família Cathedral from the outside

Sagrada Família Cathedral

Europe's most unconventional church is an emblem of a city that thinks of itself as individualistic. The church became Gaudi's life's work and he lived like recluse on the site for 16 years. He is buried in the crypt. Eight of the twelve spires, one for each apostle, have been built and work continues today, financed by public subscription.

In the 11th century, Abbot Oliva commissioned the El Cloquer tower, around which the cathedral was built in the 18th century. Adjacent to the cathedral is the Museu Episcopal de

Vic, which has one of the best collections of Romanesque artefacts in Catalonia.
